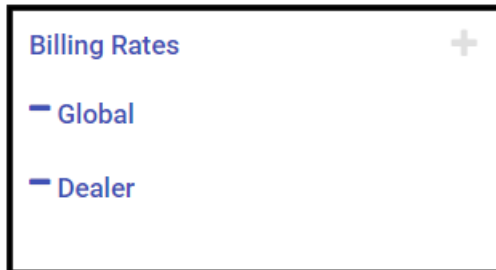


Dealer Billing Rates

The **Billing Rates** card allows you to attach a rate table to an item price and/or time price. Rate tables calculate rates based on certain requirements. For instance, if a service exists for monitoring basic alarms, the Monitoring Company might create a rate table based on the number of alarms.



Fields

- **Rate Code** – The Manitou billing identifier for the rate.
 - **Description** – An explanation of the Rate Code.
 - **Calculation Type** – Dealer and Customer Calculation types will change which rate table is used to calculate charges.
 - **Rate Charges table.**
 - **Example 1** - Number of Alarms Rate Tables. This is based on the rate code defined.
 - 0-50 alarms received has a base rate of \$5.00.
 - 51-99 alarms receive an additional rate of \$5.50.
 - Greater than 100 alarms receive a rate of \$6.00
 - **Example 2** - Number of Accounts Rate Table. This calculates the number of accounts and the billing rates related based on the number of accounts.
 - First 1000 accounts receive a rate of \$2.00 per account.
 - Accounts beyond 1000, 1001-∞ receive a rate of \$1.50 per account.
 - **Example 3** - False Alarms - When a dealer must bill customers based on excessive false alarms setting a rate table for this can better automate this process.
 - When the customer hits three false alarms in the billing period, the rate is \$5.00.
 - When they have greater than three false alarms, they will be billed at a rate of \$10.00 per false alarm.
 - **Min Quantity** – This number indicates the threshold for additional charges, for example, the number of False Alarms.
 - **Base Price** – Initial fee for a particular service.
 - **Additional Price** – Extra fees for a service, for example, a Customer exceeds a certain number of False Alarms.
